Postdoc in Biomedicine

The position is within Biomedicine, defined at the University of Skövde as the study of healthy human biology, as well as biology, diagnosis, prevention and treatment of disease conditions. Biomedicine includes subject areas of Human Biology, Medical Microbiology, Pharmacology and Pathology.

The announced postdoc position in Biomedicine is a full-time position in accordance with the Union Agreement between Swedish Agency for Government Employers and OFR-S, SACO-S and SEKO.

The position placement is in Tumour Biology and Bioinformatics research groups. The overall objective of the project is to investigate the role and functional significance of a recently identified tumour suppressor gene by the research group in tumorigenesis pathway(s). The research work includes high throughput molecular analysis followed by analysis of gene regulatory networks and modelling of signalling pathways. The position includes a maximum of 20 % teaching within related research area.

Additional assignments might be included in the position.

The qualification requirements are:

- PhD degree or the equivalent scientific qualifications in Biomedical Science or relevant subject areas. The PhD degree must have been completed within three years before the application deadline. This time limit can be extended if there are special reasons;
- experimental knowledge in Biomedical Sciences;
- knowledge of bioinformatics analysis;
- documented ability to express and communicate in written and spoken English;

In addition to the qualification requirements, the bases of evaluation for this position are:

- The level of proficiency required for the employment (see qualification requirements).
- Documented experience of molecular genetic analysis and, preferably, molecular modelling.
- Documented experience in Tumor Biology research.
- Documented experience in teaching and supervision in Biomedical Sciences.
- Proven ability to collaborate.
- Proven ability to establish good relations and network.
- Proven ability to organize and reach goals.
- Experience in experiment design, data processing and scientific presentation.

For this position special emphasis will be given to proven ability to collaborate, documented experience of molecular genetic analysis, and preferably, molecular modeling and experience in experiment design, data processing and scientific presentation.

The University of Skövde strives towards ethnical and cultural diversity as well as equal gender distribution within all employment categories.

The position is full time and limited to two years employment.
